# **New Beginnings**

September is a month of new beginnings, in some ways, even more than January. Driven, perhaps, by the beginning of the new school year, many people are returning from summer family vacations, hopefully refreshed and ready to re-enter more normal life. Many pastors see the fall as a time of implementing renewed vision as they seek to mobilize their parish family to impact their neighbourhood and community with the Gospel. Scaled-down services and programs are restored to full, normal vigour and new ones are initiated.

So, how should we then be praying as we enter this month of new beginnings? Of the various possibilities, let me suggest two possible areas of focus for our intercession.

1. Pray for our children or grandchildren who are heading off to elementary, high school or university. The world's tolerance for Christians and a Christian worldview is rapidly eroding and a growing hostility is becoming the new norm. At whatever educational level, there are those who see it as their role as educators to "liberate the children from the narrow thinking of their home, and prepare them to be world citizens" (direct quote from our sons' grade school principal in 1986). The stakes are much higher for these students than merely good grades and social acceptance. For many of the older ones, their very faith in Christ may be in jeopardy.

As well as praying for academic success, competent teachers, and accommodating roommates, let's also pray for the power of Gospel truth to rise up in their hearts. Let's use the authority that we have in the mighty Name of Jesus to stand with them against the assaults and strategy of the devil to rob them of their faith or at least neutralize any effectiveness in sharing the Gospel with classmates. Mere survival shouldn't be the goal here.

For many of the older ones, their very faith in Christ may be in jeopardy.

Pray for Christian educators, at whatever scholastic level, that they may have a fresh revelation by the Holy Spirit as to who they are in Christ, adopted children in the family of God and ambassadors of His Kingdom. May they have both the wisdom and courage to serve Him with love and yet without compromise.

2. We will soon celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ANiC at our diocesan synod in October. It has been a decade of great blessing to us who have sought to be Anglicans, faithful to the truth of the Gospel of Jesus as revealed in the written Word of God. But it has not been without cost or sacrifice. Many of our parishes from coast to coast are still in rented facilities, meeting at odd hours and without weekday access to a building. Some clergy are bone weary and struggling to impart the vision of church planting to their congregation. Returning from summer vacation may create an expectation on our pastors, perhaps indeed self-imposed, to have in hand the needed answers to the questions of growth and stability. As always, our primate, our bishops, and our clergy are in need of the prayers of the intercessors in every parish.

Below is a prayer by the apostle Paul in his letter to the Ephesian church that reflects his passionate love for them and his deep desire for them to be reminded of the Gospel, to have fresh insight into all of what Christ Jesus has accomplished on the cross. I have modified it slightly, only to make it personal and to allow us to insert the name of our bishop, rector or pastoral leaders for whom we would like to pray this prayer.

"We do not cease to give thanks for you, (insert name here), remembering you in our prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of your heart enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places." Ephesians 1: 16-20 ESV

Can you see the apostle's priorities here? He's not asking for temporal prosperity or ease of life for the Ephesian church. He's praying for a blast of Holy Spirit revelation, so that they will see more clearly than ever "the riches of His glorious inheritance and the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe"!

Does this seem a might presumptuous for us to be praying such an apostolic prayer for our leaders? I don't think so, and I fervently believe that they would be the first to agree, grateful for such anointed prayers to be offered on their behalf.

Secondly, we all struggle with "Gospel amnesia". We all forget to intentionally apply the truth of the Gospel to our day-to-day experience, even primates, bishops and clergy!

Let us, with resolute commitment through the month of September, lift these two prayer needs to our Heavenly Father, expecting visible evidence of answered prayer; stories of students having amazing opportunities to share the Gospel, pastoral leaders with fresh and exciting vision for our future, and a Church with a passion for revival in a world so desperate for God's redemption. Amen!
