Goal: \$50,000 Cdn Project impact



- This project will benefit over 4000 people
- 1200 children will be given mosquito nets to protect them as they sleep
- Thousands more will get malaria prevention education





Taking the bite out of malaria

Malaria prevention education

- 200 community healthcare volunteers will be trained to teach others
- 1800 students will learn how to prevent malaria



 840 pregnant women and nursing mothers will learn prevention techniques and how to use mosquito nets

Why malaria is worth fighting




- Mosquitoes carry the malaria parasite
- Malaria is one of the world's leading killers
- Each year 500 million people are infected
- Each year nearly 1 million die 90% in sub-Sahara Africa
- Malaria kills a child every 30 seconds

Malaria Facts:

Malaria is one of the worlds leading killers. Each year nearly 500 million people are infected and nearly 1 million die.
A child dies from Malaria every 30 seconds.

- 90% of deaths due to Malaria occur in Sub-Saharan Africa.
- It is transmitted by infected mosquitoes. Sleeping under treated
- nets can reduce child mortality by 20%. • Malaria is preventable and curable.






Planned 2011 project - Myanmar

Health improvement project

- Largest country in mainland SE Asia, yet among poorest
- 60 million people 90% Buddhist
- Recently devastated by cyclone-precipitated flooding and a famine created by a rat infestation







Planned 2012 project - Chile

Project to help povertystricken indigenous people

- Develop income-earning skills
- Build facilities and provide the tools for job creation
- Support their families
