KENYA: Growing Faith in the Fields of Kenya
Microenterprise project helps farmers to help themselves and their families

PROJECT OVERVIEW
CONTEXT: Although the land in Kenya offers great agricultural potential, more than half the nation's 31.2 million people live in poverty.
NEED: About 75 percent of the country's poorest people live in rural areas. With many people unable to afford to continue their education beyond primary school, they are limited to lives of labor and poverty.

LIFE IMPACT
BENEFICIARIES 1,200 PEOPLE
WILLINGNESS: 700 family members of farmers increase in willingness to receive Scripture and learn from it.
UNDERSTANDING: 240 farmers increase their understanding of the Scriptures after they are disciplined using Bible-based business materials.
ACTION: Those who participate in business training, take by using discipleship principles to lead their members through God's Word, increasing their food being able to send their children to school, better meals for family members, pay their bills and save money.

KENYA: GROWING FAITH IN THE FIELDS OF KENYA
Microenterprise project helps farmers to help themselves and their families

COMPLETED PROJECT
Although the land in Kenya offers great agricultural potential, more than half the nation's 31.2 million people live in poverty. About 75 percent of the country's poorest people live in rural areas. With many people unable to afford to continue their education beyond primary school, they are limited to lives of labor and poverty.
The Anglican Church of Kenya and Planting Faith Ministries, based in Nairobi, Kenya, reached out to 240 farmers in four districts with loans and business training that enabled them to grow sunflowers and also vees, improving their families' nutrition and household income. All training was Bible-based, so farmers and their families were helped spiritually and economically.
This project achieved two of its goals and underachieved a third, earning an overall rating of "Achieved."

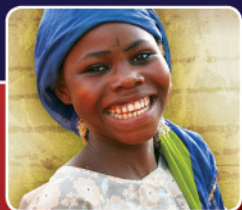
TRACK RECORD
In 2005, the Anglican Church of Kenya and Planting Faith Ministries joined forces to teach eight farmers in Kenya's Thika district to grow green beans for a local canner, earning \$1,562, or \$495.25 per farmer.
In 2006, Planting Faith Ministries worked on a larger scale with 140 farmers growing passion fruit for export, resulting in each farmer earning about \$150.
In 2007, the Church and Planting Faith Ministries worked with 200 farmers on several fronts, planting Basil of Paradise flowers in Mware Kenya South, Maly Dick flowers in Mware Kenya West and passion fruit in the Mware Kenya Central and Thika districts. Harvesting will begin in January, with each farmer expected to earn about \$250.

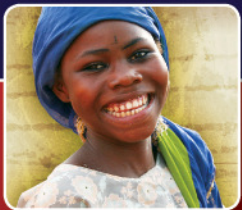

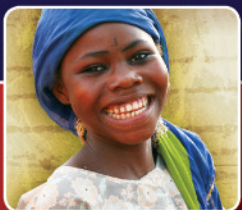
- ARDFC began in 2010 and has completed 4 projects on 3 continents for \$180,000
- From 2004 to 2011, ARDF funded 106 projects in 32 countries for \$4.9 million

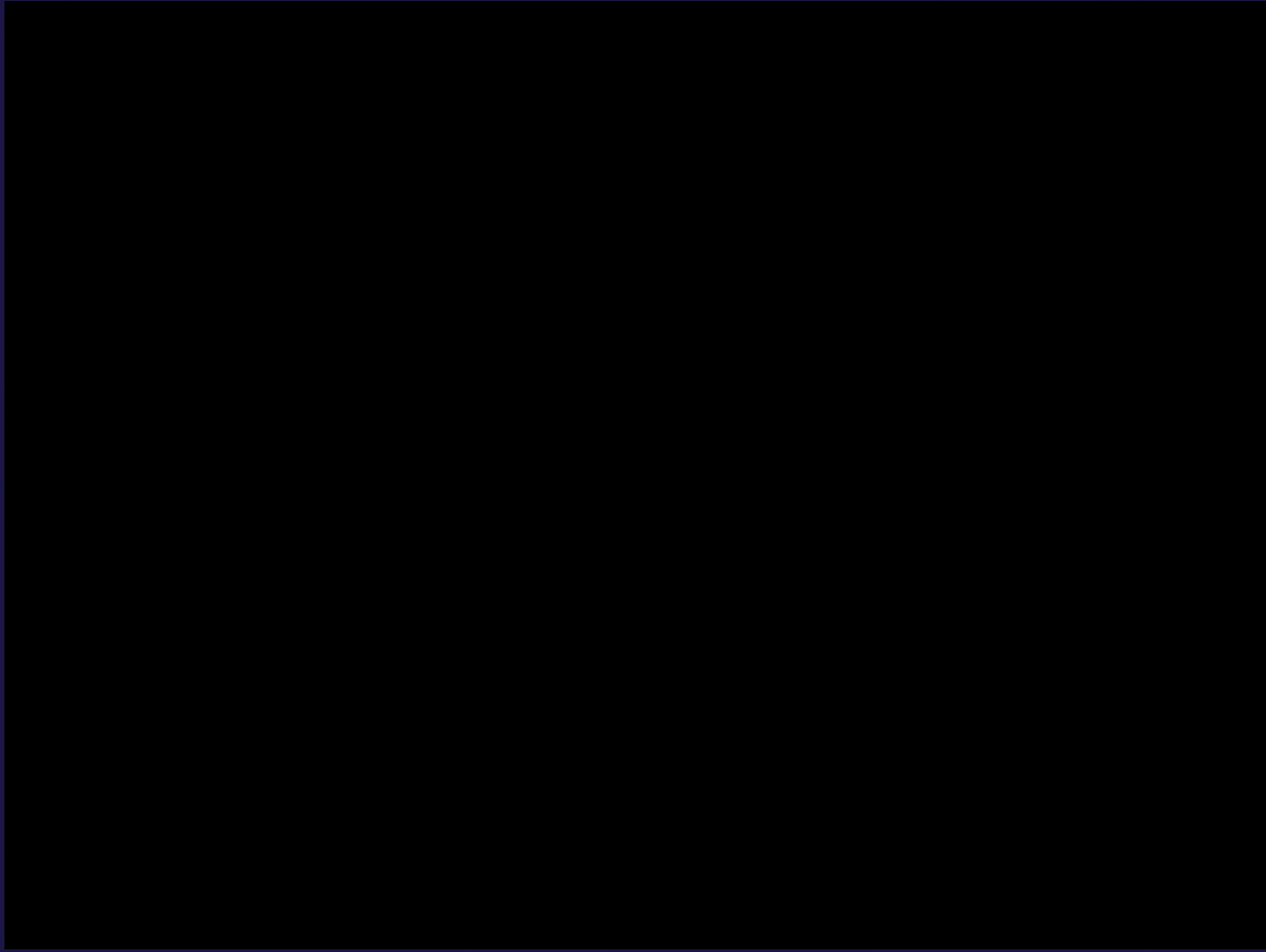

Christmas 2012 - Giving and Prayer Guide for Mite Boxes


SUN MON TUE WED THU FRI SAT

4 Soccer is a popular sport in Brazil. If you play soccer or any other sport, add 10c for each sport. Thank God for the gifts of health and opportunity.	5 Nike provided shoes and uniforms when Brazil won the Soccer 1995 World Cup. Add \$1 if you have any Nike clothing; 25c if not. Pray for adequate clothing and respect for all.	6 Families in the slums of NE Brazil often lack running water and sewer systems. Count the faucets in your home. Put in 10c for each. Pray for improved living conditions for Brazil's poor.	7 Count the cell phones in your home. Put 50c in the box for each. Pray that you and all Brazilians will hear God's voice in this busy world.	8 Did you know that Brazil produces Duracell Coppertone batteries? Count your household flashlights. Add 25c for each. Read Ps. 119:105. Pray that God's light will shine in Brazil.
11 Brazil exports large quantities of cane and refined sugar. Add 5c for each candy bar or sweet treat you had today. Pray for fair wages for NE Brazilians who work in sugarcane fields for very low wages.	12 Coffee is one of the main exports of Brazil. Put 10c in the box for each cup of coffee your family members drank today. Pray for fair wages for Brazil's coffee workers.	13 Growing cotton is an important part of Brazil's economy. Give 10c for each item you are wearing now made of cotton. Pray for the migrant workers in Brazil's cotton fields and industries.	14 Jesus came as a baby born in a stable and sleeping on straw. Add 10c for every bed in your house. Pray for street children in NE Brazil: Many sleep outdoors where it isn't safe.	15 Portuguese is Brazil's official language. Other languages are spoken also. If you are learning a new language, donate 25c. Pray that the voice of the poor may be heard.
18 It's greenhouse emissions increased 41% between 1990 and 2005. Pray for God's merciful care for the earth. If you're a faithful, pay 50c. Pray for all who are faithful to God's call.	19 Christmas is a time of colorful celebrations & special family dinners in Brazil. If you'll have a special dinner this Christmas, add \$1. Pray for those in NE Brazil who won't have a Christmas dinner.	20 Brazil has two main seasons: rainy and not rainy. Are you going away for Christmas? Add a special offering. If not, 25c. Pray for the safety of all who travel this Christmas.	21 Cattle raising in Brazil provides meat for local use and export. Add 15c for each serving of meat you ate today; 10c if you ate no meat. Pray for adequate food for all families in NE Brazil.	22 Many of Brazil's children in poorer regions never learn to read or write. Add 10c for each person in your house who can read. Pray for good education for all Brazilian children.

23 Today we light the Candle of Love
Put 25c in the mite box.
Thank God that the light of love triumphs over any darkness in our lives. God calls us to share his love with others.

24 Today we light the Christ Candle
We light the Christ candle to remind us that the light of the world was born this night. People who walked in darkness have seen a great light.

25 For God so loved the world that He gave... the best Gift ever!

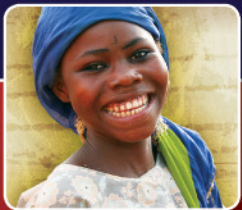
