Our speaker is Canon Phil Ashe, Chief Operating Officer of the American Anglican Council (AAC) and a leader in the Anglican Church in North America. Canon Ashe provides legal and canonical advice to churches and provides pastoral care for clergy and other leaders. He has served 24 years in the ministry and was in the legal profession before that. He currently presents educational and training materials designed to meet the needs of all Anglicans seeking to be more “missional” in 21st century America. These AAC programs include the Clergy Leadership Training Institute, spiritual coaching and peer support for clergy and Sure Foundation, a congregational development program.



This retreat is designed to provide solid Biblical teaching together with physical rest, spiritual refreshment and enriching fellowship. We want to strengthen and encourage one another in our ministry and refocus on our Christ-ordained mission: spreading the Good News, making disciplines and building the Kingdom of God.
