## Who organized GAFCON

- GAFCON was conceived and led by the Anglican Archbishops of Nigeria, Uganda, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania, West Africa, the Southern Cone and Sydney (Australia), as well as by orthodox Bishops from the UK, USA and Canada – including Bishop Don Harvey.
- GAFCON was chaired by Archbishop Peter Akinola of Nigeria.





- 1148 lay and clergy participants
  - Including 291 Anglican bishops
  - Including 42 Canadians
- Delegates came from 28 countries
- Canadian delegates were from:
  - Anglican Network in Canada
  - Anglican Essentials Federation
  - Anglican Coalition in Canada
  - Reformed Episcopal Church

#### GAFCon Final Statement

- Developed and unanimously approved by 1148 global Anglicans at GAFCON
- Signals a new reality for the Anglican Communion
- Developed in Anglican context of:
  - Militant secularism and pluralism
  - Compromised churches, "different gospel"
  - Failure to discipline heterodoxy
  - Broken communion



### GAFCON Final Statement

- Launched GAFCON movement as a "fellowship of confessing Anglicans"
  - Faithful to the gospel
  - Committed to each other, united in mission
  - Remaining in the Anglican Communion
  - Working to reform and revitalize the Communion
- Published Jerusalem Declaration
  - 14 tenets of Anglican orthodoxy
  - Signed by the Primates



#### Jerusalem Declaration

- Tenets of Anglican orthodoxy focused on:
  - The Father, Son and Holy Spirit
  - The saving gospel of Jesus Christ
  - The Lordship of Jesus Christ
  - The Great Commission of the risen Lord
  - Scripture containing all things necessary for salvation
  - God's standard of Christian marriage
  - God-given diversity and freedom in secondary matters
  - The unity of all who know Christ
  - The three historic Creeds and four Church Councils
  - The 39 Articles, Book of Common Prayer and classic Anglican Ordinal



#### GAFCON Final Statement

- Called for GAFCON Primates' Council, tasked with:
  - Recognizing and authenticating "confessing" Anglican jurisdictions, clergy, congregations
  - Encouraging Anglicans to promote the gospel and defend the faith
  - Seeking to enlarge the Council





Called for "...the formation of a province in North America for the federation currently known as Common Cause Partnership to be recognized by the Primates' Council"
